1-1 Telephone support for parent carers

Contact runs a Listening Ear service for parents and carers:

AFC Crisis Messenger service

The AFC Crisis Messenger text service is a free, confidential, 24/7 text message support service for children and young people as well as parents and carers who are feeling overwhelmed or are struggling to cope.

The service is staffed by trained volunteers who will work with you to take your next steps towards feeling better. Staff can help with issues such as anxiety, worry, panic attacks, bullying and depression and are available to talk at any time of day or night.

What is a Next Steps Meeting?

Next Steps Meetings follow decisions not to initiate an Education, Health and Care Needs Assessment (EHCNA), or not to issue an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP). They are an opportunity for families and professionals to come together to build support support around the child or young person in a positive way.

They build on what is already working well for children, and look at what else could be done too. There is new guidance available which has been developed from feedback from parents/carers and professionals.

Cognus is commissioned by the London Borough of Sutton, to provide education services to mainstream schools and specialist education providers in Sutton. They deliver a wide range of 26 services – from Admissions and Music, to SEND and Therapies.

The Cognus' Autism Service s made up of Rebecca Duffus and Kemi Awooner (who work jointly across the Autism and Paving the Way teams). They work to support young people of school age, and the schools and families around them. Consultation on the law relating to reviews of EHC plans launched

The Department for Education has launched a consultation, 'Reviews of Education, Health and Care plans: proposed timescales', on the actions that a local authority should have to take if it proposes to amend an Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan following a review meeting. They are seeking the views of parents and carers on whether local authorities should:

- * Have an additional four weeks after review meetings to finalise any changes they propose to a plan; and
- * Have to circulate material for a review meeting a week earlier than currently.
