

# Planting and community gardens

# Sutton United Foundation Community Garden

- **Location:** Sutton United Car Park, Borough Sports Ground, Sutton
- **Description:** New community garden for local residents to get involved with, including a wildlife-friendly flower bed and an untended wildlife zone
- **Benefits:**
  - Food and habitat for wildlife
  - Opportunity for community involvement and physical activity
  - Improve appearance of entrance to football ground
- **Funding required:** £2,000 (with £4,000 in match funding from EFL Building Fund, and ongoing funding from Foundation prize draw)



# Tree Planting on Woodmansterne Lane

- **Location:** Nearby Wallington High School for Girls, Woodmansterne Lane, Wallington
- **Description:** Replace three street trees
- **Benefits:**
  - Improve the appearance of the area
  - Contribute to environmental aims: air quality, carbon net-zero, flood alleviation, biodiversity
- **Funding required:** £1,500



# Sensory Garden at Hill House

- **Location:** Community Garden, Hill House, Bishopsford Road, St Helier
- **Description:** Develop the Community Garden by turning an unloved corner into a sensory garden, purchasing a new lawnmower and establishing a wormery
- **Benefits:**
  - Reducing isolation by bringing members of the public together for Social Gardening, including referrals from Age UK, Social Prescribers and mental health support groups
  - Increasing recycling through composting
  - Improving a facility that is open to anyone
  - Encouraging outdoor activity
- **Funding required:** £3,600



# Community Spring Bulb Planting

- **Location: Boroughwide**
- **Description:**
  - Volunteers representing a range of groups including Park Friends and Resident Associations will plant a variety of approximately 40,000 spring bulbs across the borough
- **Benefits:**
  - Brightening up the borough at the beginning of spring
  - Providing an opportunity for community involvement
  - Many of the flowers provide an early nectar source for pollinators
  - Demonstrating a well cared for and looked after public environment
- **Funding required: £6,000 (with in-kind support from over 100 volunteers doing the planting)**

# Stanley Park Community Hedge Planting

- **Location: Stanley Park, Carshalton**
- **Description:**
  - The Sutton Tree Wardens and the Friends of Stanley Park working together to plant a native hedge along the western boundary of Stanley Park and along part of the border with Stanley Park Junior School
- **Benefits:**
  - Providing for wildlife in the park without taking space from the sporting area
  - Improving the appearance of the park by introducing more greenery
  - Improving the privacy of the school with year-round cover from beech trees
  - Benefitting the environment by filtering air pollutants, reducing flooding and sequestering carbon
  - Opportunity for community and schools' involvement in planting
- **Funding required: £1,059 (with in-kind support from volunteer time in planting)**

# Manor Park Shrub Beds and Bee and Butterfly Area

- **Location: Manor Park, Sutton**
- **Description:**
  - Purchase plants to improve the quality of the park, including plants for the bee and butterfly area by the playground
- **Benefits:**
  - Helping biodiversity
  - Improving the attractiveness of the park for its many visitors
  - Investing in the shrub beds, an area identified for improvement by visitors and the Green Flag inspector in 2023
- **Funding required: £4,000**

# Meadow Close Hedge Planting

- **Location: Meadow Close, Sutton**
- **Description:**
  - Supply and plant 8 hawthorn bushes to replace large gaps in council-owned hedge in Meadow Close in the Sutton Garden Suburb conservation area
- **Benefits:**
  - Enhancing the conservation area and replacing bushes which have died
  - Providing habitat for wildlife, including nectar for pollinators and berries for birds
- **Funding required: £950**



# Planting at The Grange

- **Location:** The Grange, Beddington Park
- **Description:**
  - New planting of hardy, disease resistant roses and perennial plants that support pollinators - to include climbing plants on the pergola
- **Benefits:**
  - Enhancing the colour and beauty of the area where many park users sit and picnic
  - Caring for a heritage asset by restoring the Victorian garden to its former glory
  - Filling gaps with plants that will endure changing climatic conditions
  - Improving wellbeing by enhancing an area that is open for anyone to use for pleasure, rest and socialising
- **Funding required:** £2,900



# Heritage and community asset improvements

# Green Wrythe Lane Allotments Rainwater Harvesting for Irrigation

- **Location:** Green Wrythe Lane Allotments
- **Description:** Providing approx. 30 plastic water butts for plots; reconnecting one existing dip tank to the main water supply
- **Benefits:**
  - Demonstrating potential of moving away from reliance on main water supply
  - Sustainably addressing insufficient water supply during summer
  - Reducing demand and cost of drawing from the main water supply
  - Minimising waste of winter rainfall by storing water
- **Funding required:** £1,600



# Sutton Ecology Centre Repair and Restoration of Pond-Dipping Platform

- **Location:** Sutton Ecology Centre, Carshalton
- **Description:**
  - Repairing the pond platform at Sutton Ecology Centre to allow it to be reopened
- **Benefits:**
  - Providing an accessible space for residents to encounter wildlife for wellbeing benefits and education
  - Enabling biodiversity education sessions and activities for children and families from across the borough and beyond
  - Enhancing The Ecology Centre which is open to the public who come for walks and to enjoy nature
  - Encouraging pro-environmental behaviour
- **Funding required:** £8,039.63 (with support in-kind from supervised Sutton Biodiversity volunteers doing the repair work)

# Woodcote Green Heritage Board

- **Location: Woodcote Green, Wallington**
- **Description: Replace damaged heritage information board**
- **Benefits:**
  - Improve the appearance of a public open space
  - Promote interest in the history of the area
- **Funding required: £1,500**



# Nonsuch Mansion Repair of Turret Roof

- **Location:** Nonsuch Park, Cheam
- **Description:** Replacement of the roof which is beyond its useful life and now leaking. Replacing existing defective Redland tiles with slate tiles that reflect Grade II listed status of building.
- **Benefits:**
  - Improving efficiency of the building and using hard-wearing natural slate tiles with lower carbon footprint than fibre cement
  - Preventing further degradation of the roof's integrity and damage to the historic rooms below
  - Maintaining the building as an attraction and events venue
- **Funding required:** £18,967 (with £18,967 match funded by Epsom and Ewell Borough Council, who run the park together with Sutton)



# Corrigan Avenue Rec Replacement Park Welcome Sign

- **Location:** Corrigan Avenue Recreation Ground, Clockhouse
- **Description:**
  - Replacing welcome sign that was removed due to vandalism
- **Benefits:**
  - Providing useful information such as contact details for the Parks Team
  - Enhancing the appearance of the park
- **Funding required:** £1,500



# Beddington Park Allotments Water System

- **Location: Beddington Park Allotments, Beddington**
- **Description:**
  - Replacing current water system which is in poor condition due to age
- **Benefits:**
  - Improving a facility which provides an opportunity for activity and socialising
  - Promoting local food production to reduce carbon footprint
- **Funding required: £5,000**



# Demesne Road Allotment Water System

- **Location: Demesne Road Allotments, Wallington**
- **Description:**
  - Upgrade the water system at Demesne Allotments to manage the demand from an increased number of active plots
- **Benefits:**
  - Improving a facility which provides an opportunity for activity and socialising
  - Promoting local food production to reduce carbon footprint
- **Funding required: £6,000**

# Carshalton Park The Grotto Repairs

- **Location:** Carshalton Park, Carshalton
- **Description:**
  - Carefully remove graffiti from the Grade II Listed Grotto and repair a damaged section of brickwork
- **Benefits:**
  - Preventing further damage to the structure from water entering brickwork
  - Protecting a heritage asset and improving the appearance of the park
- **Funding required:** £5,500



# Grove Park Notice Board

- Location: Grove Park, Carshalton
- Description:
  - Provide a second notice board, in a different location to the existing one, to inform the public users of the park of local issues and events
- Benefits:
  - Promoting community involvement
  - Enhancing the park
  - Reaching a wider range of people who may not access information through the internet
  - Providing ecological and historical information about the park
- Funding required: £3,000

# Sutton Cemetery Chapel Improvements

- **Location: Sutton Cemetery, Sutton**
- **Description:**
  - Repair and repaint the damp walls of the chapel where paint is bubbling and flaking
  - Replace the inadequate, uncomfortable seat pads on the wooden pews and seating
  - New carpet to replace one which is over 20 years old
- **Benefits:**
  - Making the chapel a more accommodating and appropriate environment for those hosting ceremonies for loved ones
  - Maintaining a council-owned building which is let out for funerals within a multi-faith cemetery
- **Funding required: £25,000**



# Oaks Park Bakehouse

- **Location:** Oaks Park, Carshalton
- **Description:**
  - Refurbish the Bakehouse of the old Oaks Mansion to preserve it as a heritage asset and turn it into a small information and visitor centre for the park. This would complement the Friends of Oaks Park's work remarking the chalk outline of the mansion
- **Benefits:**
  - Providing a place for information about the history and ecology of the park, with display boards and reference books
  - Promoting community engagement and interest in history
  - Possible use of the venue for exhibitions and group trips
  - Future intention to clear the area around the Bakehouse of brambles and to landscape it with pollinator-friendly plants
- **Funding required:** £25,000 (with £25,000 match funding promised by the leaseholder of the cafe, and in-kind support from their architect making drawings)

# School Air Quality Audit and Engagement

- **Location:** A school in the borough of Sutton - first come first served, with those in areas with most significant air quality and road safety issues advertised to first
- **Description:**
  - Sutton Council working with school leadership to come up with a suite of measures which will improve air quality within and around schools
  - Sustrans providing engagement activities in the school
- **Benefits:**
  - Encouraging change in behaviour by engaging with school staff, pupils, and parents/carers about the impact of air pollution
  - Reducing air pollution in the local environment
  - Improving road safety
  - Opportunity for community collaboration
- **Funding required:** £13,101

# Sutton Opportunity Pre-School Sensory Garden and Play Area

- **Location:** Sutton Opportunity Pre-School, Wallington
- **Description:** Levelling out and surfacing outdoor area to make it accessible for play; planting of sensory garden
- **Benefits:**
  - Facilitate more community get-together open days
  - Provide outdoor play for pre-school children
  - Helping with exercise and regulation of children's needs, which is beneficial for their well being
  - Accessibility for children with different needs
  - Food and habitat for wildlife
- **Funding required:** £10,000





# Honeywood Mice Sensory and Music Playgroup

- **Location:** Honeywood Museum, Carshalton & Circle Library, Carshalton
- **Description:** Providing 56 weekly music, art and play sessions for babies 0-3, with art activities for parents/grandparents/carers that run in tandem. Free at point of use.
- **Benefits:**
  - Supporting early childhood development: emotional literacy, communication, understanding themselves and the world around them
  - Reaching a wide demographic
  - Improving parents' mental health and wellbeing through educational music, art, and community building
  - Visiting Family Hubs facilitators offering support for struggling parents
- **Funding required:** £16,033 (with £4,712 in kind support)



# Breast Pump Hire Scheme from Health Visiting Team

- **Location: Boroughwide - run by the Council of the London Borough of Sutton**
- **Description: Startup costs for the Health Visiting Team's breast pump hire scheme**
- **Benefits:**
  - Improving mothers' experiences of early breastfeeding and increasing numbers of mothers who reach their breastfeeding goal
  - Promoting health and wellbeing
  - Reducing waste and energy consumption
  - Reducing health inequalities
  - Cost saving for families
- **Funding required: £1,709**

# Sutton's Summer of Stories

- **Location:** London Borough of Sutton Libraries & Heritage Houses (11 venues)
- **Description:** London Borough of Sutton Cultural Services working with local practitioners to provide a free children's literature festival during July-August 2025
- **Benefits:**
  - Providing enrichment and learning opportunities through a varied programme of events and activities, including specialist SEND content, and volunteer opportunities for older children
  - Encouraging library use and learning about local history
  - Promoting reading as a key learning tool
  - Strengthening Sutton's cultural landscape through a series of opportunities for community participation
  - Promoting health and wellbeing
- **Funding required:** £11,906.40 (with £5,895 match funding in room hire fees and council staff time)



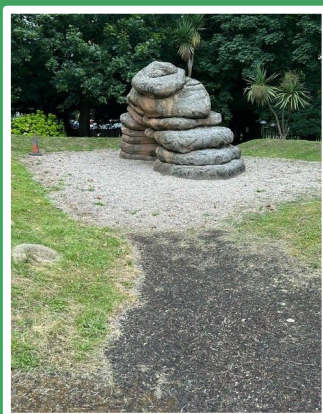
# 'Pony Corner' at The Diamond Centre

- **Location:** The Diamond Centre for Disabled Riders, Carshalton
- **Description:**
  - Providing a stable area for non-ridden equine activities, designed to cater for the needs of all clients
- **Benefits:**
  - Enabling expansion of the successful 'Tea with a Pony' & 'Horse Care' sessions, aiming to double to around 30 participants each week
  - Providing an accessible area that is comfortable and safe, and can be used all year round
  - Facilitating a therapeutic experience that benefits users and their family and carers and provides a sense of achievement
- **Funding required:** £23,400



# The Grange Play Centre Improvements for 'Challenging Play' Area

- **Location:** The Grange Play Centre, Wallington
- **Description:** Installing a handrail with a low fence up the steep pathway, levelling uneven ground, and adding more pebbles to the safety floor around the climbing rocks; purchasing more risk taking apparatus, e.g. balance beams, den building equipment, small climbing wall
- **Benefits:**
  - Promoting physical activity and enabling risk taking challenges for children with SEND or physical disabilities
  - Accessed by a wide range of users including Specialist Schools in the local area, families with children with SEND, and NHS Children's Physiotherapists
- **Funding required:** £18,000



# FlowerGrid Project

- **Location:** St Nicholas Centre, Sutton
- **Description:**
  - Asian Resource Centre of Croydon working with Duffus Community Foundation to provide an initial six week programme of free nutrition workshops, diabetes education and yoga/pilates sessions in January to February 2025
- **Benefits:**
  - Addressing health inequality by providing targeted support for women and older people who experience barriers to healthcare
  - Providing a positive influence on participants' wider community
  - Promoting community and overall well being
- **Funding required:** £5,000 (with in-kind support from the Duffus Community Foundation providing a venue)



# Playground improvements

# Cheam Rec Playground Replacement Equipment

- **Location:** Cheam Recreation Ground, Cheam
- **Description:** Replacing one springer, and three rotating poles at the end of their lifespan with a rocket roller, a multispinner and a spinner bowl
- **Benefits:**
  - Replacing items that are no longer usable
  - Providing more exciting play equipment that can be used by children together
  - Encouraging physical activity and social play
- **Funding required:** £25,000





# Dale Park Playground Replacement Inclusive Items

- **Location:** Dale Park Playground, Carshalton
- **Description:**
  - Install an inclusive roundabout and other inclusive play items at Dale Park Playground to replace worn-out equipment, this may include sensory boards, a musical item or basket seats
- **Benefits:**
  - Improving inclusivity to encourage interaction and confidence building
  - Encouraging activity and socialising for children and families
- **Funding required:** £15,000



# Manor Park Hopscotch Grids

- **Location: Manor Park, Sutton**
- **Description:**
  - Remark the existing faded hopscotch grids with thermoplastic markings
- **Benefits:**
  - Making the hopscotch grids more attractive for play
  - Increasing the lifespan of the grids
  - Simple and cost effective way of enhancing the playground
  - Encouraging physical activity
- **Funding required: £600**

# Sutton Green Swings Replacement

- **Location: Sutton Green, Sutton**
- **Description:**
  - Replace the failing junior swings at Sutton Green with a two bay swing unit with inclusive seats and potentially a basket swing
- **Benefits:**
  - Increasing safety and improving attractiveness of the play area in a busy place
  - Improving inclusivity
  - Encouraging activity
- **Funding required: £10,000**

# Cuddington Rec Playground Improvements

- **Location:** Cuddington Recreation Ground, Worcester Park
- **Description:**
  - Replace the dilapidated multi use play unit and the old play panels at Cuddington Rec playground
- **Benefits:**
  - Increasing attractiveness of the playground, which is next to a busy nursery
  - Providing safer equipment
  - Significantly upgrade the playground with more challenging equipment
  - Replacing old and under-used play panels to brighten up the playground and provide sensory stimulation and social enhancement through imagination and role play
- **Funding required:** £30,000

# Grove Park New Playground Gates

- **Location:** Grove Park, Carshalton
- **Description:** Replace four playground gates with yellow gates to be clear to people with some visual impairments
- **Benefits:**
  - Solving problems with the current gate closers having to be replaced or adjusted
  - Making the playground safer and improve access for children and carers with visual impairment
- **Funding required:** £7,700



# Cheam Rec Playground New Pathways

- **Location: Cheam Recreation Ground Playground, Cheam**
- **Description:**
  - **Linking up the playground with tarmac pathways where the grass has worn away**
- **Benefits:**
  - **Making it easier to use the playground during wet weather months when the ground becomes waterlogged**
  - **Improving the appearance, safety and accessibility of the playground**
  - **Promoting physical activity and play**
- **Funding required: £8,000**

# Roundshaw Park Playground Fencing

- **Location:** Roundshaw Park, Wallington
- **Description:**
  - Replace the remaining wooden fencing with metal bow top fencing
- **Benefits:**
  - Keeping the playground a safe and secure area to visit, since the wooden fencing has started to fail due to age
  - Making the playground more welcoming with more attractive fencing
  - Encouraging physical activity and socialising
- **Funding required:** £16,000

# Grove Park Playground Safety Surfacing Replacement

- **Location:** Grove Park, Carshalton
- **Description:**
  - Replace matting panels that are lifting and full of sand with a better safety surfacing such as wet pour
- **Benefits:**
  - Enhancing one of the busiest playgrounds in the borough
  - Continuing to make the playground safe
- **Funding required:** £16,400

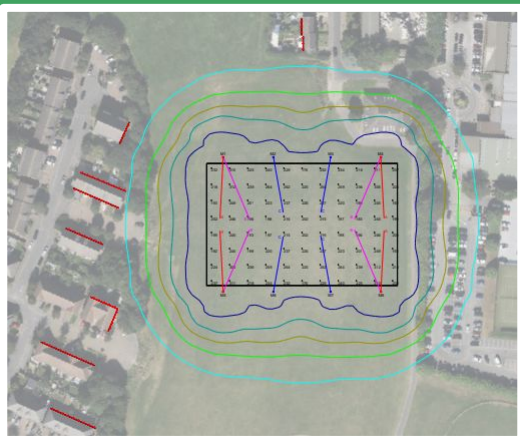




# Sport and activity facilities

# Roundshaw Playing Fields Football Floodlights

- **Location:** Roundshaw Playing Fields, Wallington
- **Description:**
  - Install floodlights to facilitate football training for a wide range of players
- **Benefits:**
  - Enabling training and matches all year round on a safe, floodlit grass area, including for children, women, players with disabilities and walking football players
  - Encouraging physical activity and improving wellbeing
  - Helping Sutton Common Rovers to develop as a community club
- **Funding required:** £20,000 (with £80,000 in support from Premier League LED Floodlight Fund)



# Cheam Rec Replacement Outdoor Gym Equipment

- **Location:** Cheam Recreation Ground, Cheam
- **Description:**
  - Replacing two worn-out items of outdoor gym equipment and installing rubber mulch surface around all the equipment
- **Benefits:**
  - Replacing equipment which is at the end of its lifespan
  - Promoting physical activity
  - Improving youth activity and provision
- **Funding required:** £8,400



# Corrigan Avenue Rec Replacement Outdoor Gym Equipment

- **Location: Corrigan Avenue Rec, Clockhouse**
- **Description:**
  - Replacing two worn-out items of outdoor gym equipment
- **Benefits:**
  - Replacing popular equipment which is at the end of its lifespan
  - Promoting physical activity
  - Improving youth activity and provision
- **Funding required: £6,000**



# Belmont Park MUGA Repainting and Surface Colouring

- **Location: Belmont Park, Belmont**
- **Description:**
  - Repaint and colour the surfacing in the Multi Use Games Area
- **Benefits:**
  - Improving a popular, enclosed facility for football and basketball
  - Remarking badly faded lines
  - Enhancing the play experience with with surface colouring
- **Funding required: £3,200**

# Cheam Rec Tennis Court Refurbishment

- **Location: Cheam Recreation Ground, Cheam**
- **Description:**
  - **Repaint lines and colour the courts' surface; replace the worn-out nets**
- **Benefits:**
  - **Encouraging physical activity**
  - **Improving the appearance of the courts**
- **Funding required: £9,500**



# Roundshaw Park Replacement Outdoor Gym Equipment

- **Location:** Roundshaw Park, Wallington
- **Description:**
  - Install three gym items at Roundshaw Park to replace worn-out items, including a Dip Bar, Push Up and Calisthenics Centre
- **Benefits:**
  - Maintaining a facility which is used daily by people of different ages for exercise and socialising
  - Providing activities for local older children on school travel route
- **Funding required:** £13,311.59



# Roundshaw Park Replacement Skate Ramp

- **Location:** Roundshaw Park, Wallington
- **Description:**
  - To install a quarter pipe in the skating area at Roundshaw Park, replacing the half pipe that was previously removed
- **Benefits:**
  - Responding to a request from skaters to improve the design of the ramps
  - Encouraging activity
  - Reducing social exclusion by providing facilities for younger people
- **Funding required:** £7,200



# Cheam Rec Tennis Courts Boundary Fencing Replacement

- **Location: Cheam Recreation Ground, Cheam**
- **Description:**
  - **Replace damaged chain link fencing with more substantial fencing that will last for many years with minimal maintenance costs**
- **Benefits:**
  - **Improving the tennis courts facility**
  - **Improving the appearance of the rec**
  - **Reducing future maintenance costs**
- **Funding required: £38,000**

# Parks and open space improvements

# Carshalton Bowling Club Fencing Replacement

- **Location:** Grove Park, Carshalton
- **Description:** Replace broken fencing at rear of the bowling club and increase the height of three gates
- **Benefits:**
  - Improve appearance of public space
  - Improve safety by preventing children and animals from reaching electrified fox fence
  - Prevent damage to the green and clubhouse from trespassing, avoiding council repair costs
- **Funding required:** £6,500



# Sparrow Farm to Nonsuch Mansion Replacement Pathway

- **Location:** Nonsuch Park, Cheam
- **Description:** Excavating the existing footway and laying a new surface with a pre-cast edge, adding topsoil and grass seed around the path
- **Benefits:**
  - Improving the park for the approx. 250,000 people who visit each year
  - Improving safety and accessibility of a main route through the park to its main facilities, including the public toilet
  - Responding to wear and tear from increased use of the park since pandemic lockdowns
- **Funding required:** £12,240 (with £12,240 match funded by Epsom and Ewell Borough Council, who run the park together with Sutton)



# Nonsuch Park London Road Car Park Resurfacing

- **Location:** Nonsuch Park, Cheam
- **Description:** Resurfacing of London Road car park
- **Benefits:**
  - Upgrading from existing rough gravel surface, which is increasingly prone to flooding and pothole formation
  - Improving the attraction of the park as an events venue for hire, providing essential maintenance income
  - Enhancing appearance, safety and efficiency of the car park, preventing accidents and minimising damage to vehicles
- **Funding required:** £56,113 (with £56,113 match funded by Epsom and Ewell Borough Council, who run the park together with Sutton)



# Cheam Rec Surfacing Under Cafe Picnic Tables

- **Location:** Cheam Recreation Ground, Cheam
- **Description:**
  - Add surfacing around the picnic tables to level the ground
- **Benefits:**
  - Making the picnic tables easier to access
  - Improving the appearance of the picnic area
- **Funding required:** £2,000



# Roundshaw Park New Paths

- **Location:** Roundshaw Park, Wallington
- **Description:**
  - 1) Adding a path following well-trodden route from Lindbergh Road to the path by the playground,
  - 2) Adding a second path from Mollison Drive to the top park entrance on Foresters Drive
- **Benefits:**
  - Facilitating walks organised by local walking group for older residents
  - Improving access to the park for exercise in wetter months
  - Improving health, wellbeing and companionship
  - The route cuts across the park away from main road
  - The route joins up with a nearby transport link which is regularly used by school children
- **Funding required:** £38,850



# Elm Ponds Desilting

- **Location:** Elm Ponds, Wallington
- **Description:**
  - To remove a large build up of silt from Elm Pond which will allow for two new pumps to be fitted
- **Benefits:**
  - Improving the pond, which is popular with residents and visitors as a place to spend time outside
  - Improving the appearance of the local area, where the pond is a feature
- **Funding required:** £30,000 (including £3,600 contingency if any repair needs are discovered when the pond is drained)





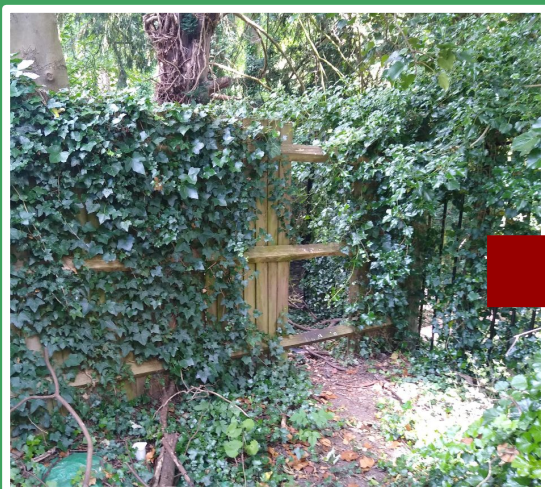
# St Mary's Field Gate Replacement

- **Location: St Mary's Field, Wallington**
- **Description:**
  - **Replace the missing main entrance gate on Bute Road**
- **Benefits:**
  - **Making the park more secure for use by children, and dog walkers**
  - **Making the park safer for use by children who visit from nearby SEND school**
- **Funding required: £980**



# The Grove Water Mill Replacement Railings

- **Location: The Grove, Carshalton**
- **Description:**
  - **Replace broken wooden fence with two metre high railings**
- **Benefits:**
  - **Preventing trespass and vandalism of Grade II listed historical structure**
- **Funding required: £4,400**



# Grove Park North Street Wall and Corner Pier Repairs

- **Location:** Grove Park, Carshalton
- **Description:**
  - Replace dismantled wall with a brick corner pier and metal railings. The park boundary is currently secured by a temporary wooden fence.
- **Benefits:**
  - Enhancing The Grove as a conservation area
  - Providing a permanent boundary to keep the park secure when it is locked at night
- **Funding required:** £24,000



# Poulter Park Knee Rail Fencing

- **Location:** Poulter Park, Carshalton
- **Description:**
  - Install knee rail along access road at Poulter Park
- **Benefits:**
  - Responding to request from Park Friends group to replace the knee railing to help protect the meadow area from vehicular access
  - Improving safety by making the road clearer to park users
- **Funding required:** £9,500

# Grove Park Leaning Wall Replacement

- **Location: Grove Park, Carshalton**
- **Description:**
  - Replace leaning wall along the boundary between the park and the Lower Pond, rebuilding to ground level and installing black bow top railings
- **Benefits:**
  - Improving the appearance of the park from the ponds and the road
  - Carrying out work that will eventually need to be done, as part of the wall has already been dismantled for safety
  - Discouraging graffiti
- **Funding required: £19,500**

# The Grove Gates Repainting

- **Location:** Grove Park, Carshalton
- **Description:**
  - Rub down and repaint the gates on North Street, Mill Lane, Old Watercress Walk and near the Cafe; repaint the bow top railings and near the Lower Pond and the railings opposite the Ecology Centre
- **Benefits:**
  - Improving the appearance of the entrances into the park and making it look more welcoming
- **Funding required:** £9,950



# The Grove Gates Repainting Opposite the Ecology Centre

- **Location: Grove Park, Carshalton**
- **Description:**
  - Rub down and repaint the two pedestrian and vehicle gates at the entrance opposite the Ecology Centre
- **Benefits:**
  - The gates and supporting framework have a lot of flaky paint and need rubbing down thoroughly and repainting
  - Improving the appearance of the entrance into the park
- **Funding required: £9,750**

# Cheam Rec Path Flooding Prevention

- **Location:** Cheam Recreation Ground, Cheam
- **Description:**
  - Build a grass bank (bund) along the edge of the gravel path to the cafe to prevent the water from running onto the path and around the cafe
  - Arrange a camera survey of the drains to check that there is no damage or blockage
  - Jet clean of drains to remove buildup of sand
- **Benefits:**
  - Enhancing the park and making it more accessible when there is heavy rainfall
  - Preventing potential damage to the cafe from water pooling against the building
- **Funding required:** £10,000



# Rosehill Park West Overflow Car Park

- **Location:** Rosehill Park West, Rosehill
- **Description:**
  - To resurface the left hand side of the overflow car park to match the recently resurfaced right hand side
- **Benefits:**
  - Addressing the safety issue of an uneven surface with crevices and deep holes in a very busy area
  - Enabling potential situation of storage containers for Sustainable Cycle Training equipment to replace a facility which is no longer available
  - Improving an existing car park which is used by many visitors and is letting the park down in its current condition
- **Funding required:** £16,000

# Rosehill Park West Toilet Upgrade

- **Location:** Rosehill Park West, Rosehill
- **Description:**
  - Invest in two vandal-proof sink units to complement other anti-vandalism measures
- **Benefits:**
  - Keeping the toilets open for visitors to use, which is critical for the many events which are hosted in the park
  - Supporting the busy cafe and other activities that happen nearby, including British Cycling activities, pump track cycling, dog walking and Community Payback
  - Making the most of previous investment in improving the toilets and protecting them from vandalism
  - The council will consider the future possibility of introducing a paid-entry approach to deter vandalism
- **Funding required:** £12,000
